Must have a designated liaison in the Idaho District Contact Information (IDCI). Updated from ISEE.




Title I-A Homeless Set Aside (2)



Requirement #2 – Allocation & Set Asides Tab

Homeless set aside amount is sufficient to provide for the needs of MV students.



Title I-A Homeless Set Aside (3)



Requirement #3 – Homeless Education Tab

Check the number of MV students is proportional to the amount allocated in set aside.



Best viewed in 1280 X 1024 resolution.

Applies to all LEAs receiving any Federal funds

(ESEA Act, Title I-A as amended by ESSA Title IX-A; McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Act VII-B; and Child Nutrition/WIC Reauthorization Act of 2004)

- Funds may be used for funding the designated district liaison position, transportation services or other allowable uses.
- Funds must be used only as a last resort when funds or services are not available from other public or private sources, such as the USDA's National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program, public health clinics or local discretionally funds (sometimes provided by LEA Education Foundations) used to provide similar services for economically disadvantaged students generally. ESEA section 1115 (e) (2)
